Directions for use

The wood must be clean, dry and stable. The humidity of the wood should never exceed 18%. The substrate must also be sucking and without previous treatments of varnish, paint and the like.

Contaminated surfaces must clean with appropriate cleaner and treated with Micronil 126.

New woodwork may also be contaminated, and it is recommendable to treat with Micronil 126

Apply the Wood oil with a sponge, brush or roller. Repeat the treatment until the wood aperies uniformly and saturated, however, without forming surface film.

Retreatment is usually 1-2 times a year or as needed.

Spray: Protective clothing, PU-gloves and shield. A2P3 mask, with air supply when needed.
